



<b>Pre-arrival</b>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Read the International Student Guide
<b>Healthcare</b>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Check the information about Healthcare in the UK.
<input type="checkbox"/>	EEA nationals: obtain a <a href="#">European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)</a> before coming to the UK.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Consider benefits of private medical insurance, which might offer provision over and above the NHS health care treatment you may be eligible for in the UK.
<input type="checkbox"/>	If you receive on-going medical treatment and / or medication, obtain a letter from the doctor in your home country (in English) with the details as it may be useful for your new doctor. Check whether you can take your medication on your flight and through customs.
<b>Finances</b>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Consider how much money to bring to the UK with you (and whether your home country restricts the amount of cash that can be taken out of the country) and/or whether to travel with Travellers' Cheques. You should request money in £5, £10 and £20 notes as £50 may not be accepted for smaller payments.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Establish whether your bankcard can be used in the UK and whether your bank can provide any advice about transferring money to the UK.
<b>Immigration (for non-EEA nationals)</b>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	All students from outside the EEA will need an appropriate visa for study purposes. You cannot study on a visitor / tourist visa.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Check the details of your Tier 4 visa are correct.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Make photocopies of your passport and visa.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Carry a print out of the CAS email in your hand-luggage as well as any other documents used for your visa application.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Carry the contact details of the University and your accommodation address in your hand-luggage.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Book an appointment online for <a href="#">Police Registration</a> if required.
<b>Transportation</b>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Establish when you are required to arrive at your College and when you can access your accommodation. Ensure you have arranged at least short-term accommodation.

<input type="checkbox"/>	Determine the best way to get to Cambridge when you arrive in the UK.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Consider travel insurance.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Consider baggage restrictions on your flight.
<b>Preparing to study</b>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Check the information about international student orientation events.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Contact the <a href="#">International Student Team</a> if you are unsure about anything.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Review course handbooks.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Review College information packs.
<b>Living in the UK</b>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	Check whether you need an adaptor for any electrical equipment you intend on bringing to the UK.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Consider the <a href="#">UK climate</a> for items of clothing.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Consider whether you need personal possessions insurance.
<b>On arrival:</b>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	If you are coming from a country outside the European Union and bringing in money worth 10,000 Euros you have to declare that sum to customs officers.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Register with your College.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Present passport and visa to College within 7 days of arrival if you are from outside the EEA.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Attend matriculation.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Attend College induction.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Attend Faculty/Department induction.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Complete student registration with the University.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Register with the University Library.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Register with GP (doctor).
<input type="checkbox"/>	Open a bank account.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Purchase phones/SIM cards if required.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Purchase TV licence if required.
