UoC Asymptomatic COVID-19 Screening Programme: Easter Term Week 7 (7th June – 13th June 2021)

Participation

All 31 Colleges of the University of Cambridge and 5 Houses of the Cambridge Theological Federation participated in the screening programme.

We estimate that there are currently **12,800** students present in Cambridge **and** resident in College accommodation. Approximately **89%** of these students have agreed to participate in the screening programme, of whom **44%** contributed a swab.

Some students participating in the programme who did not contribute a swab may have had COVID-19 in the preceding 90 days, or be participating in NHS screening as a clinical medical student.

Students screened

All participating students present in Cambridge and resident in either College **or** private accommodation were invited to take part, provided they did not meet pre-determined exclusion criteria.

1,883 pooled samples were received and processed at the testing facility. Of these, **11** were reported as "void" (this may be due to a variety of reasons, including inappropriate packaging and leaking samples).

In total, 5,480 students contributed to pooled sample collection, including 5,440 students with valid results.

Results

The final pooled screening test results were:

Members of the **2** positive pools were invited for individual confirmatory tests. As of Monday 14th June, all students had been re-tested. Of the positive pools:

- 2 pools were true positives (i.e. included at least 1 student confirmed to be positive on individual testing). 2 students from these pools had positive individual confirmatory tests.
- **0** pools were operational false positives (i.e. all individual confirmatory tests were negative, following a positive pooled screening test).
- **0** pools have outstanding results.

Additionally, **32** asymptomatic students were screened individually, for example on their return to Cambridge, and did not participate in pooled sample collection. **0** students tested positive for SARS-CoV-2.

Based on these data, we estimate that the weekly incidence of asymptomatic SARS-CoV-2 infection amongst students screened last week was approximately **1 in 2,700** students (**0.04%**).
