# UoC Asymptomatic COVID-19 Screening Programme: Lent Term Week 6 (1<sup>st</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> March 2021)

## **Participation**

All 31 Colleges of the University of Cambridge and 6 Houses of the Cambridge Theological Federation participated in the screening programme.

We estimate that there are currently **6,850** students present in Cambridge and resident in College accommodation. Approximately **87%** of these students have agreed to participate in the screening programme, of whom **60%** contributed a swab.

Some students participating in the programme who did not contribute a swab may have had COVID-19 in the preceding 90 days, or be participating in NHS screening as a clinical medical student.

#### Students screened

All participating students present in Cambridge and resident in either College **or** private accommodation were invited to take part, provided they did not meet pre-determined exclusion criteria.

**1,825** pooled samples were received and processed at the testing facility. Of these, **9** were reported as "void" (for a variety of reasons, including inappropriate packaging and leaking samples).

In total, **4,320** students contributed to pooled sample collection, including **4,295** students with valid results.

## **Results**

The final pooled screening test results were:

Members of the **1** positive pool were invited for individual confirmatory tests. As of Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March, all students had been re-tested. Of the positive pools:

- 0 pools was a true positive (i.e. included at least 1 student confirmed to be positive on individual testing).
- 1 pool was an operational false positive (i.e. all individual confirmatory tests were negative, following pooled screening test results).
- **0** pools have outstanding results.

The operational false positive rate for all pooled screening tests to date has been approximately 1 in 400.

Additionally, **81** asymptomatic students were screened individually, for example on their return to Cambridge, and did not participate in pooled sample collection. **0** students tested positive for SARS-CoV-2.

Based on these data, we did not identify any asymptomatic SARS-CoV-2 infection amongst students screened in the last week.
